


Hillary Hays,

Al started his military career with the 19th Special Forces Group as a Special Forces Engineer. He then acquired additional training as a Special Forces Medic where he spent 5 years with 10th Special Forces Group. Al has 12 combat deployments spanning 50+ months deployed in combat zones, while receiving numerous military valor awards, and a valor award from the FBI presented directly by the FBI Director. Al is culminating his special operations career serving in an Army

Special Missions Unit as a Special Operator filling multiple leadership roles for the past 15+ years.

2009 initially as a rifleman in 7th Marine Regiment in Twenty nine Palms, CA; where he became a Scout Sniper, earning the MOS in 2010. In 2011, Jerome attended assessment and selection for Marine Forces, Special Operations Command (MARSOC), and subsequently graduating the training pipeline in 2012, where he was stationed aboard Camp Lejeune, NC. As a Marine Raider, Jerome deployed multiple times in support of the Global War on Terror to the Sahel and Maghreb regions of Africa, holding a multitude of billets and experienced an array of complex problems that were largely unknown to the outside world.

MY CAREER TRANSITION:



From the Navy to Carrington Mortgage Holdings

I didn't have the normal Navy life. Spending 22 years as an Operations Specialist, my

career started out that way with over six years on my first ship. Then after shore duty, I ended up in Bahrain for 15 months and then with EOD (Explosive Ordnance Disposal) working with Unmanned Underwater Vehicles.

I spent the last six years in the Navy with the Navy Special Warfare community -- and I felt lucky to end my career that way, with that experience.

It was my last tour that introduced me to The Honor Foundation and provided the opportunity for me to be a part of it. I knew it was a great program but hesitant to do all the extra work that was involved. However, I kept an open mind and was thankful that I did.

I was hooked from the first day of class, and

now, could not imagine had I not gone ahead and applied. The content, the resources, the people -- my coach, the faculty, the THF Team, Fellows in my cohort and the Alumni -- exceeded my expectations in all aspects and provided constant support in every way possible. I am afraid of where I would be at this time if I had not gone through THF. But it is the organization's connections and network that helped me land the amazing job that I have now. A fellow teammate that had been in the cohort before mine and had landed a position with <u>Carrington Mortgage</u>. I was excited for her but not excited about real estate and mortgages.

Bruce Rose, the CEO and Founder of The Carrington Companies, was the guest speaker for one of our classes and his words struck a chord with me. I was in awe of his story, and how much he does for active duty Military and Veterans, including his contributions to THF so the community can experience the program when preparing to leave service.

I could not email him fast enough to thank him for his time and what he does for the military. Immediately following his words of wisdom I felt full of gratitude, inspiration and optimism that leaders like him are out there. With a few laughs and email exchanges later, he requested a follow-up call. Again, I thought, I cannot picture my next career in mortgages or real

estate, but I was not going to pass up the opportunity for this call with Bruce and the one-on-one time that he is investing in me.

After a 45-minute conversation, he said he needed my senior leadership in his company. I was blown away...I was not expecting that. Introductions followed and after speaking with other members of the Carrington team, I learned about Project Management roles -- exactly what I was searching for as I transitioned. I ended up having an interview with the Chief Information Officer and a Senior VP of IT solutions, which is who the PMs work under.

I felt prepared during my conversations and interviews -- thanks to the preparation and coaching I received from THF. The Carrington team made me feel welcomed and valued from Day 1, especially Bruce who I cannot thank enough. I am currently on my third week with Carrington and could not be happier.

If it was not for THF, I would likely be still looking for a job and a company that I'd be honored to work for. Thank you THF -- my gratitude lies with you, Bruce and all those who helped me on my journey.

OUR NATION'S VETERANS

Efforts to Impact More Transitioning Military Veterans

On May 12, THF CEO Matt Stevens appeared before the House Veterans' Affairs Committee, providing testimony during a congressional hearing on military transition amid the COVID-19 pandemic.

"The COVID-19 pandemic exacerbated the existing challenges and stressors presented to transitioning service members and increased the difficulty of executing a [transition assistance] program," said Stevens during his opening statement to the committee.

"A service member's last act of service to our country while in uniform should be to have an exceptionally positive transition. [They] should set the example for all of those in the next generation, as this will reinforce the idea to all who follow that the military as an institution 'has their backs.'

This concept is ideal for recruiting, great for retention, and even better for the morale of those remaining in uniform."

Members of the panel, with Congressman Mike Levin presiding, asked questions regarding the unique challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic on Special Operations Forces seeking to transition out of the military.

Stevens highlighted two critical factors most veterans face during transition: "Figuring out what they want to do next, how to talk about themselves, and develop their value proposition and personal narrative."

The hearing, convened by the Subcommittee on Economic Opportunity, also featured testimony from several other nonprofits and organizations, administration officials from the Department of Defense and Department of Labor, and others.
